

GARDEN WASTE

Leaves and flowers	Invasive species such as Japanese Knotweed. For further guidance please click here (www.gov.uk/guidance/prevent-the-spread-of-harmful-invasive-and-non-native-plants).
Grass and weeds	Plastic bags and black sacks.
Tree bark and pruned branches	Any painted or treated wood.
Clippings and twigs	Soil and turf
Logs up to 30cm (12 inches) in diameter or 2m (79 inches) in length.	Stones, rubble, plant pots and bricks
Cut flowers and household plants	Animal/pet waste including faeces, bedding and litter.
	Logs exceeding 30cm (12 inches) in diameter or 2m (79 inches) in length.
	Food waste including fruit from your garden
	Any other non-garden waste including paper, card, textiles, plastics, metals and nappies (even if biodegradable).

FOOD WASTE

Although other plastics are not permitted in food waste collections we do accept compostable bags with the seedling logo, (which means they conform with the relevant standard BS EN 13432). Your local council may supply compostable bags or alternatively they are widely available at most supermarkets, many hardware stores, and through online suppliers. We can only accept liners with the seedling logo, as these will break down during the composting process. If you don't wish to use liners, you can place your food waste loose into your food waste container for collection.

All uneaten and leftover food and plate scrapings	Non-food products including nappies (Even if biodegradable)
Tea bags and coffee grounds	Packaging of any kind
Out of date or mouldy food, removed from packaging	Any material that is not food waste including paper such as tissue paper, newspaper and card
Raw and cooked meat, including bones and chicken carcasses.	Liquids such as milk - these may leak causing spillages when transporting the food waste
Raw and cooked fish, including bones	Oil and liquid fat
Dairy products such as cheese, but excluding milk	Plastic bags, film or any other plastic not conforming with BS EN 13432
Eggs and egg shell	Garden Waste including wood and cut flowers.
Rice, pasta, beans and noodles	
Baked goods such as bread, biscuits, cakes and pastries	
Fruit and vegetables including raw and cooked vegetables, peelings, skins and fruit stones
